Join us for a day of training, dialogue, and collaboration for state and federal investigators and prosecutors of child abuse and child pornography.



**Who:** Kristina Korobov is a National and International trainer on sexual violence and child abuse. Her background includes prosecuting family violence and child abuse, and serving two years as a Senior Attorney for NDAA where she provided training and technical assistance to child abuse prosecutors.



**Gary Sussman** has been an AUSA for 22 years. He serves as the Project Safe Childhood Coordinator for the District of Oregon. Before he was a lawyer, Gary was a detective at the Portland Police Bureau from 1976-1987.

**Kelly Zusman** is the Appellate Chief at the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Oregon. She has been an AUSA since 2004, having previously served as a federal judicial clerk. Kelly also serves as the 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit representative to the Attorney General's Appellate Chief's Working Group.

He has prosecuted numerous child exploitation cases, many of them involving the possession, production or distribution of images of abuse. Michael serves as a resource to child abuse prosecutors state-wide.
